GUEST SPEAKERS FOR ILIFF WEEK

Vice-Chancellor Robert S. McCollum

Born in Denver, Robert S. McCollum graduated from Amherst College and has taught at the Deerfield Academy in Massachusetts. He served in the United States Air Force in the Pacific.

Formerly the deputy administrator in the U. S. State Department's Bureau of Security and Consular Affairs, he is president of the Colorado division

of the American Association for the United Nations, a director of the United States Committee for Refugees, and a Director of CARE.

In the fall of 1964, he toured South America under the sponsorship of the Partners of the Alliance, and in the summer of 1965 he made an extensive visit to Europe, with Russia as a principal stop.

For his dedication to the problems of refugees and his work in helping to resettle new immigrants to America, he was decorated by the Italian government in 1959 and the Dutch government in 1961.

Locally, he has been president and a member of the Denver City Council, a member of the Metropolitan Intra-City Council, a member of the Board of the Denver Public Schools, and an assistant to a former mayor. Besides, he is founder and chairman of the Board of the

Dr. Clifford M. Drury

Clifford M. Drury, professor emeritus of Church History at San Francisco Theological Seminary, San Anselmo, California, was born in Northwest Iowa and received his B.A. degree at Buena Vista College. He then served in Chem-

ical Warfare, U. S. Army, World War I. Following the war, he graduated from San Francisco Theological Seminary with the B.D. degree. Dr. Drury did post-graduate study in the University of Edinburgh and received his Ph.D. degree in 1932. Before going to teach at San Francisco Theological Seminary in 1938, he held pastorates in Berkeley, California, Shanghai, China, and Moscow, Idaho. He holds the honorary degrees of Doctor of Divinity, Doctor of Literature and Doctor of Humane Letters.

He was the first Presbyterian Chaplain in the U. S. Naval Reserve (1933) and was called to active duty in 1941. He served with the U. S. Navy Chaplains' Corps during World War II, and was appointed the historian, editing and writing a five volume history of the Corps.

Dr. Drury has written seven volumes on the history of Oregon Mission of the American Board. These include biographies of Marcus Whitman, Henry H. Spalding, Elkanah Walker, and a three volume work on "The First White

Bishop James K. Mathews

Bishop James K. Mathews was born in Pennsylvania but was reared in Ohio and Texas. He received his undergraduate work at Lincoln Memorial University; his theological training at Biblical Seminary in New York and the Boston University School of Theology. His doctorate in philosophy was a study of the religious teachings of the late

Mahatma Gandhi and was accomplished at Columbia University. Further study was at Cambridge University in England.

After a brief pastorate in the U.S.A., he volunteered for service in India where he was both pastor and a district superintendent. During World II, he served as a Chaplain with the United States Army in India.

Following the World II, he was elected as an Associate Secretary and later as Associate General Secretary of the Methodist Board of Missions in New York City, with responsibility for the Church's missionary effort in forty countries.

Bishop Mathews is perhaps the only man who has been elected Bishop twice. First, he was elected Bishop by the Indian Church but resigned before consecration, believing they were ready for native episcopal leadership. Then,

Women Over the Rockies." This third volume will soon be off the press. His total works published now amount to fifteen volumes.

Dr. Drury was chosen to be the Dr. Martin Rist Lecturer of 1966. This lectureship was created on the Occasion of the twenty-fifth year of teaching by Dr. Martin Rist at Iliff. Other Rist lecturers include Dr. Ernest C. Colwell, President, School of Theology at Claremont, and Dr. Robert M. Grant of the Federated Theological faculty of the University of Chicago.
